The Norwegians in Eau Pleine

The following article first appeared on October 26, 1973 in the "Stevens Point Daily Journal"

Two years ago Mr. and Mrs. Fred Frederickson of Junction City gave me a document, written in Norwegian, which states in its preamble that it is a "short history of the Dancy Norwegian Evangelical Congregation located in the vicinity of Dancy in Portage and Marathon Counties."

The history was written by Pastor Ingvar Grothe Monson and dated Dancy, May 31, 1896.

It was while serving as a pastor in Amherst from 1892 to 1896 that he became acquainted with the Dancy community and assisted the people there in organizing a congregation of the Lutheran faith affiliated with the one-time Norwegian Synod.

Monson begins his history by relating that "already in the 1870s Scandinavians were beginning to move into the Dancy vicinity, then known as Hutchinson." ...

... But to continue the history of the "Dancy" congregation, which Mrs. Frederickson says was actually always known as the Eau Pleine congregation.

Pastor Monson relates that the first to preach here was N.B. Berge, a visiting pastor from New Hope in eastern Portage County.

He died in 1883 and after him Pastor Nils Forde from Amherst visited the group three or four times a year until he left for Starbuck, Minn. in 1892.

Pastor Monson followed Forde in Amherst, but was not asked to come to Dancy until 1894 when a meeting was held in the home of Knut Olson for worship services together with baptism for two children.

A question of doctrine had arisen among the members and after this was explained by the pastor to the satisfaction of the group. a meeting was called in 1894 by Monson for the purpose of organizing a congregation.

The first board of trustees included Markus Iverson, Ole

Fladvad and Mathias Ingebretson. Gunder Berg was elected secretary and Knud Olson treasurer. Ole Larson promised the congregation a church lot and the following member families were enrolled as charter members in the new congregation: Ole Larson, Christian Tufte, Gunder Berge, A.G. Petterson, Knud Olson, I. Mortenson, Ole Fladvad, M. Iverson, O.P. Phillipson, J. Anderson,

From the President's Pen . . .

I am excited about sharing my experiences with difficult ancestors when I talk to you about Brick Walls in April. I believe I was given difficult relatives because I never give up until I figure out the puzzle. This is my second time as President as I served in the mid 1970's. Over the years I have gone to National Genealogical Society and Federation of Genealogical Society conventions. I have taken classes at SLIG (Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy), GRIP (Genealogical Research Institute of Pittsburgh) and IGHR (Institute of Genealogical and Historical Research at Samford). I have had week long classes on Irish, German & Welsh research. Other classes were Genealogical Writing, Advanced Methodology, Professional Genealogy and the Revolutionary War & the War of 1812. I volunteered for years in Madison at the local Family History branch where I was willing to help with problems patrons had no matter the location. I personally have ancestry from England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, Norway, Germany and France that I know about.

If you were there for the election you know I am also President of the Wild Rose Historical Society. We have a wonderful museum there which occupies lots of my time in the summer. The museum has an old house built in the 1880's, a blacksmith shop/barn, a one room school, the carriage house, Pioneer Hall which has a pharmacy, ice cream parlor as well as many old pictures and the 1905 Wild Rose robbery display, the last building has a weaving room, a country store and a gift shop. The museum is run by volunteers so the hours are 1-3PM on Wednesday and Saturday from June 15 to the Saturday of Labor Day weekend. If you are there by 3PM your will still be given the tour. I also submit a picture a week to the Waushara Argus on Wild Rose history. That task often requires me to find out a person or two in the picture as well as some information I can find about the person or building.

Encourage people to come to our meetings even if they do not have Portage County ancestry. Since so many people show up early, feel free to bring questions like where can I find information on a specific topic or area. I am sure we might be able to direct you to good sources that will possibly solve your problem.

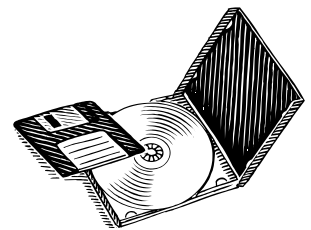

E. and G. Ingebretson, J. Nilson, M. Moller and A. Thomasson.

A small church was built about a mile south of Dancy in the Town of Eau Pleine, but there was little increase in the Scandinavian migration to the township to support it. Starting with 47 "souls" in 1894, which included the families of the above, the number had increased to only 70 by 1914.

The church stood on its old site until 1910 when it was moved to a more central location, on land donated by a Mr. and Mrs. Borsak.

A cemetery site had been given the congregation by Sam Forseth but was never used for this purpose. Instead members used a cemetery away from the church which had been donated by Christ Christianson, a Swede. It is known today as the Runkle Cemetery.

Early pastors who served the congregation on a visiting basis

were, aside from Nils Berge and Forde, Ingvar G. Monson. 1894-96; C.J.M. Hovde, 1897-1902; L.O. Olen, 1902-03; O.T. Boe, 1903-05; G.C. Ulen, 1905-07; and O.T. Boe from 1901 apparently to 1914 or 1915. (The record is not clear.)

In later years, the congregation was served by pastors from Trinity Lutheran Church, Stevens Point, who held services on Sunday afternoons.

Use of the church was discontinued in about 1955 and the congregation affiliated with Trinity. The old church building stood on County Trunk H east of Highway 34, on what is now the Norman Albert farm. It was razed a few years ago to make way for a high voltage line.

The Runkle Cemetery remains in use and here the Norwegians and Swedes, as one observer commented, "can get together without arguing."

arrived in the U.S. in June 1868
under the name MANCZEWITZ.
At the same time, on the same
ship was another MANCZEWITZ
family. The father's name could
not be read from the records, but
the spouse was Catherina and
the children were Rozalia,
Julianne, Johann, Paul and Anna.
Jacob and the unknown father may
be related.

Jacob MANCZEWITZ married
Mary BARDON, daughter of
Andrew or Paul BARDON in 1858.
His sons were Vina, John, Jacob,
Joseph and Valentine. Jacob
and his son Jacob changed their
names to MANSAVAGE or
MANSAVITZ. The balance of the
family retained the MANKIEWICZ
name. The family lived in Stockton,
Polonia, Fancher, Plover, and
Stevens Point. Vina (Vincent),
married Anna PERSZYNSKI,
daughter of Mike PERSYNSKI and
Mary SOSNOWSKI. At the time of
their marriage, her name was Anna
WIZA, from a previous marriage.
Vina may have also married Anna
GROCHOLSKI. On 18 February,
1889 Vina married his last wife,
Katherine KEDROWSKI or KIE-
DROWSKI, daughter of
Andrew KEDROWSKI or
KIEDROWSKI and Magdalena

BEMOWSKI. The Andrew
KIEDROWSKI family may have
come from Minnesota. Andrew
KIEDROWSKI's first wife was
Josephine/Justina CYBULSKA.
Magdalena, his second wife, was the
daughter of Frank BEMOWSKI and
Katherine BRUFSKI or BRUSKI.
Vina's children were Pieter
(Peter), born 1890, Daniel, Christie,
Margaret, Clare, Leonard, Mary and
Genevieve. Vina's family moved to
Milwaukee.

SPAGS Spotlight on Research

As an ongoing feature of *Pedigree Pointers* each issue we will highlight and introduce members to a specialty research facility, archives, or library.

This fall we would like to introduce the **Pommerscher Verein Central Wisconsin Library** at the Berlin Center in the former Berlin Elementary School in Marathon County, Wisconsin.

The library is located at 11248 Berlin Lane, northwest of Wausau. Take County Hwy K (Old Hwy 51) north, turn left on County Hwy A west to Hwy O. Turn right (north) on Hwy O for 2 miles to Naugart Drive. Turn left (west) 1 mile on Naugart Drive. At the intersection of Naugart Dr. and Berlin Lane, turn left (south) and then almost immediately turn right into the Berlin Center driveway. Please use the door on the south side.

The library is open the second Saturday of each month from 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. and at other times by appointment.

Inside you will find a variety of resources. The Dewey Decimal system is used to classify books. All material is in the card catalog and in a catalog file on the computer. Title, Author, and Subject cards are all in one card catalog. Some examples of materials you will find in the library include:

Local church records, histories, anniversary booklets, & directories:

Lutheran and Methodist. Some records start in 1860 - 1861. Five of the German language record books are now in English; another is currently being translated.

German language dictionaries:

Both Platt Low German and High German dictionaries; There is also a Mennonite dictionary as their language is a dialect of Platt Deutsch.



Maps, atlases, and gazetteers:

Who/What is a Pommer?

In the 1800's Pomerania was a state or province in the old German/Prussian Empire, with the Baltic Sea on its northern border. Now Pomerania is divided between eastern Germany and Poland.

Pomeranians spoke a unique kind of German, called Platt Deutsch or Low German. People in other northern German provinces also spoke Platt Deutsch: Silesia, Schleswig-Holstein, Mecklenburg, and West- and Ost (East) Preussen (Prussia), plus parts of Brandenburg and Posen.

We invite all people with a Low German heritage to join us in preserving our language and culture.

Horace A. Warner Wedding List 1857-1877, PCHS SC#221

The following transcribed marriage list, sorted alphabetically by groom, is taken from the file housed at the UWSP Archives. Unfortunately, documentation is lacking of where the list came from or when it was donated. Horace A. Warner was a native of Vermont and moved to Portage County in 1854. He moved back East in 1858 before returning to the area a year later. Warner was a minister and circuit rider in the Methodist Episcopal church for most of his adult life. Upon his death in 1879 at the age of 86, his obituary in the *Portage County Gazette* mentions he married 1800 couples in his lifetime. 111 of those marriages are listed here. Some of the marriages, especially those before 1865, were never recorded at the Courthouse and therefore have never appeared in an index until now. A number of others in Orleans County, VT and dated from the late 1830's, are transcribed online elsewhere.

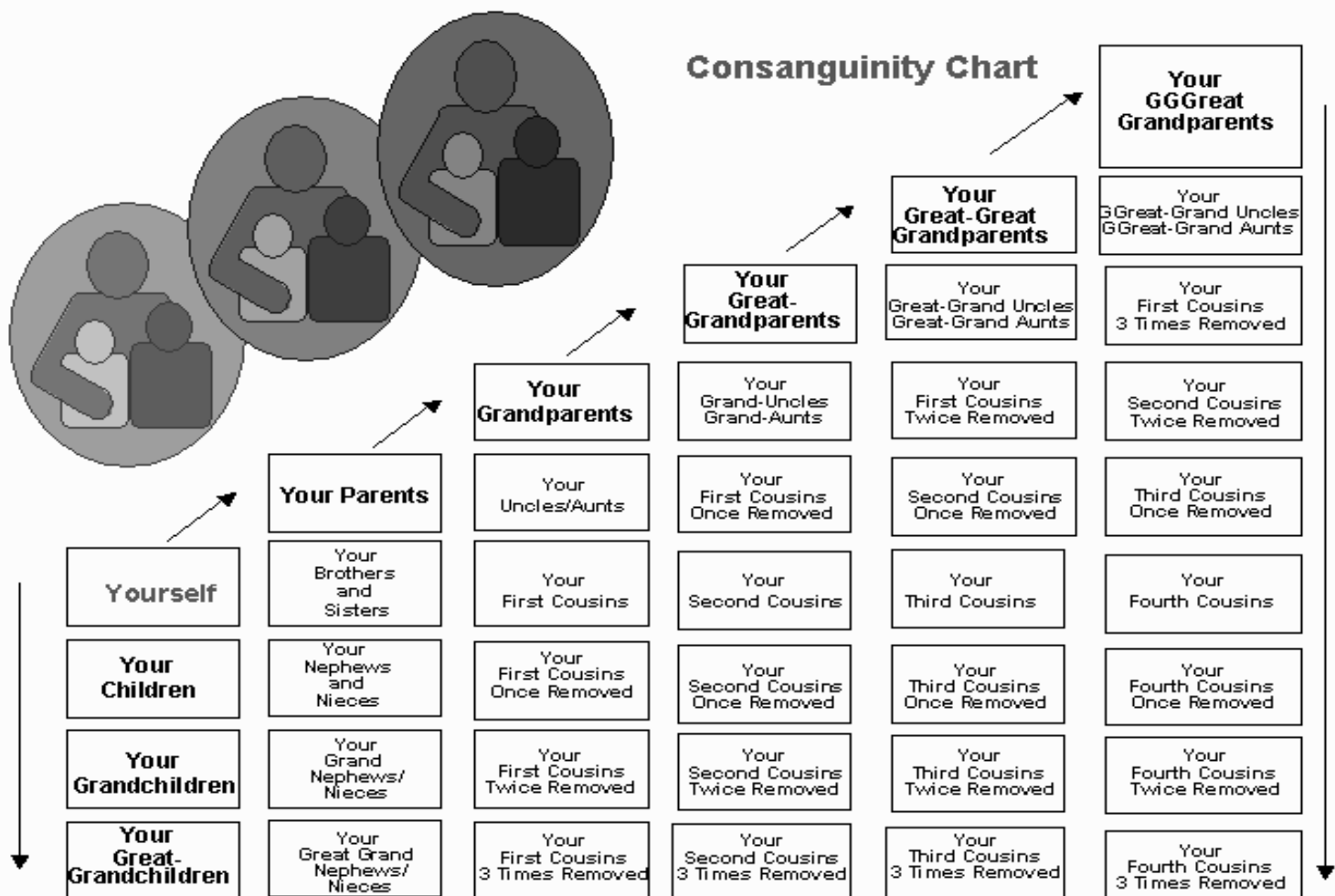

Who's Who at the Family Reunion?

Consanguinity - The state of being descended from the same ancestor. After you study this chart a few minutes you will begin to see that defining your relationship to each of your relatives will be much easier. Begin by plugging-in the names of family members, in the appropriate boxes. Starting at the top of each vertical column is the least confusing. As you go from the top of each column downward, you will plug-in the children of the people in the box just above. The chart serves as an easy way to help define relationships for the non-genealogists in the family.

Naturalization Indexing Projects

Portage County Public Library Now a Family History Center Affiliate

As reported in our last newsletter, you can now order film from the Family History Library in Salt Lake City and have it delivered to the Portage County Public Library to view there. To do so, go to www.familysearch.org, Sign In (you'll need to register to do this), click on Search, Catalog, and find the film you want to order by searching via Place Names or Film Numbers. Once you've found the film number you want to order, click on the number and you will be taken to the Online Film Ordering page. If you have never placed an order you will be asked for billing information. You will also be asked to choose which facility you want the film delivered to. Short-term loan is \$7.50 per microfilm reel. The film must be returned within 90 days. A 60-day renewal option is available after your short-term loan expires. Earlier this year, more records were uploaded to Birth/Baptism, Marriage, and Obituary/Death Indexes for the smaller newspapers of Portage County. This includes newspapers from Amherst, Rosholt, Junction City, Plover, and Almond besides Stevens Point. There are a good number of people whose deaths do not appear in the existing Central WI Genealogy Index from the *SP Journal* or *Gazette* but do now appear in our index. Some also contain different or additional information not included in the other obituaries.
